Winifred Proud, one of the founders of the Richmond Branch, had served on various committees of the Branch for over 30 years, including being the president for 2 terms. Mrs. Proud helped launch the first Richmond Branch student recital.

Being a music pedagogue throughout her life, at age 99, Mrs. Proud was one of the finalists for Wisdom of Age Mentorship Award (Leisure Care Lighthouse Awards program in the Lower Mainland), "given to an individual who has demonstrated a commitment to making a difference in the lives of children."
